Andy is a process improvement consultant and six sigma specialist. He has worked in a variety of posts.

Andy Brown is a Lean Enterprise Specialist, a Six Sigma Master Black Belt and a Chartered Engineer with the Institute of Mechanical Engineers.

Andy studied a Masters Degree in Mechanical Engineering at London's Imperial College. During this time Andy gained experience working with Rolls-Royce and British American Tobacco.

In 1998, Andy joined Visteon, a large tier one automotive systems supplier, where he initially worked as a manufacturing engineer applying lean principles to develop and implement a process streamlining strategy within the plant.

In 2001, Andy was trained by the Six Sigma Academy as a Black Belt and went on to achieve certification, successfully completing 3 projects, delivering over \$400K of savings to the company. He continued to drive Six Sigma within the organisation by delivering numerous waves of Green Belt and Champion training to colleagues and senior managers. Andy has mentored belts on numerous projects developing confidence and expertise in the DMAICT process leading to successful project completion.

Andy joined the BHW in 2004 and has worked with many of our clients.

He has run a number of trainer development events with Network Rail to develop their internal competency in training delivery at Green Belt and Black Belt level. He has worked closely with the company's Master Black Belt candidates to increase confidence and competency as the organisation moves towards self-sufficiency.

At Rolls-Royce Andy has been active in developing and delivering a Design for Six Sigma programme. He has mentored a number of project teams in the application of the methodology to bring about performance improvements.
